Subject: A Strategic Approach Toward the Iran Regime's Constitution

Dear President Trump,

For many years, I have written to senators, published books, and even reached out to our strongest allies in the Middle East, conveying one simple but critical message: the Constitution of the Islamic Regime of Iran contains explicit language—across eight specific clauses—that translates politically and legally into “Death to America.”

Although these officials and allies acknowledged the seriousness of this issue with appreciation and even admiration, nothing meaningful was done. In fact, policies often moved in the opposite direction.

As a result, we changed our narrative inside Iran and told our countrymen and women the truth:

No government in the world—especially not the United States or Israel—seeks true regime change in Iran. For over four decades, the Ayatollahs' regime has functioned as a golden egg-layer for the Military-Industrial Complex and the Western financial system. The ruling oligarchs of the regime have looted more than one trillion dollars of Iranian national wealth and deposited it in Western institutions.

Even more valuable than this looted wealth has been Iran's massive brain drain. Fifty years ago, serious experts predicted Iran would soon become “the Japan of the Middle East,” and that prediction was correct—our people are capable, educated, and ambitious. But that potential has been consistently harvested by foreign powers, both West and East.

Mr. President,

You are a man who understands power, strategy, and cost. Therefore, I respectfully say:

Do not bomb Iran — Bomb the Constitution of the Regime.

By “bombing the Constitution,” I mean something simple, peaceful, and powerful:

Make a five-minute address in which you read the eight clauses from the Iranian Constitution that openly define hostility toward America and its allies.

Instead of killing regime elites with drones, confiscate their assets in the United States and the West. You know who these oligarchs are, and this action would cost the American taxpayer nothing.

If you do these two things, the movement in Iran for electing a Constitutional Assembly (Moassessan) will immediately gain momentum. Iranians will finally have the opportunity to remove the constitution imposed by Khomeini 46 years ago through deception—what Shi'a tradition calls "Khodaa"—a fact he openly admitted in the summer of 1979.

Finally, Mr. President, you cannot successfully negotiate with a regime whose constitutional intent is to harm or destroy you. No serious leader would ignore such written doctrine.
