Dear Mr. President,

Please believe me when I say this with urgency and pain: there is a simple and cost-free way to end the Ayatollahs' regime in Iran, yet instead the United States keeps choosing a hard and hopeless path.

I am not blind to the pressures you face from the Military-Industrial Complex—those who are waiting to test and use what they have built and stored in military depots. But Iran does not need bombs. Iran needs the truth to be spoken about its constitution.

The Iranian elite—people you know and have heard of—have already risked their lives to demand constitutional change:

June 2019: Led by the late Dr. Maleki and Mr. Noorizad (now in prison), 14 brave Iranians openly called for change.

September 2026: Mir-Hossein Mousavi, the first Prime Minister of the Islamic Republic, still under house arrest, issued a manifesto signed by 800 elites, including 160 university professors.

October 2026: Seventeen courageous women, including Nobel Prize winner Narges Mohammadi and the heroic lawyer Nasrin Sotoudeh, raised their voices despite knowing the price in prison and torture.

And yet, the Western media ignores the most important point: the demand for constitutional change. For twenty years, every genuine movement inside Iran has been sabotaged or overshadowed by the same opportunists and spoilers who jump in and distort the struggle.

If only you—or even just one advisor—would read Iran's constitution and publicly express America's shock at the eight anti-American clauses within it, everything would change. The slogans in Iran would shift instantly toward a real, peaceful, and achievable solution.

I beg you to one day speak openly about Iran's constitution. You will not need to do anything else. The Iranian people—millions of them—will take it from there.
