

Subject: On Iran, Non-Military Strategy, and Your Critics

Dear Mr. President,

Today, Sunday January 18, I watched CNN and FOX, listening to commentators, former officials, and university professors speak about Iran. It honestly made me sick to my stomach. These people have never studied the Constitution of the Islamic Republic of Iran, have no idea what the Ayatollahs are taught in their seminaries, yet they speak confidently about “what is happening in Iran” and “what the United States must do.”

Even more ridiculous, some tried to blame you personally for the massacre that Khamenei is responsible for.

As I have repeatedly said: read Iran’s Constitution. There are more than eight explicit articles mandating hostility and terror against America, and many more that authorize internal brutality against the Iranian people—decreed by the Ayatollahs in ways that are not Islamic and violate the Qur’an itself. I have proofs directly from the Qur’an showing why the Ayatollahs’ Constitution is anti-Islam and anti-Qur’an. But that is not the subject of this letter.

To borrow a famous phrase: “It’s the Constitution, stupid!”

I even made a banner stating: “Any narrative, interview, or article about the crisis in Iran that does not reference its Constitution is useless and simply repeats the old ignorant narrative we have heard for decades.”

Today, I want to address your critics who ask: “Why did President Trump say he supports the demonstrators militarily but did not attack Iran?”

These commentators have no idea what is in your mind, nor do they understand the complexity of the formula that involves the Military-Industrial Complex, the Oil-Industrial Complex, and the Banking-Financial Complex—all tied into the New York Stock Exchange.

The very forces that drove the Dow Jones up nearly 30% in the first year of your second term should silence any so-called economist who challenges your economic strategy. What they do not realize is that your long-range vision is preparing America for the era of Artificial Intelligence, which is coming much faster than the era of the Internet.

To properly answer your critics, they must understand that a non-military solution for Iran—one that targets the Ayatollahs’ Constitution instead of attacking Iran militarily—is the real solution.

Let me give one example: In October 2020, you signed an order to plant two billion trees in the United States. And at Davos, you proposed planting the same number in Africa to combat global warming. It was a genius proposal, but because it was not expensive, nobody paid attention.

This is exactly why the Constitutional solution against the Ayatollahs—without military budgets, without casualties, and without feeding the war-lobbies—is not attractive to fake news and to the military lobbies. They do not let such solutions become mainstream.
