

Subject: A Peaceful Strategy to End the Iranian Regime's War Constitution

Dear Mr. President,

For thirty years I have written to American leaders about a truth that has been hiding in plain sight: the Constitution of the Islamic Republic of Iran is a written declaration of war against the United States. No expert, no report, no intelligence briefing is needed—only the ability to read the words that the Ayatollahs wrote for themselves.

I first wrote to my own Senator, Dick Durbin, because of his constitutional experience. Later, when you entered office, I began writing to you directly. The names changed, but the warning never did.

Our latest book, *The Road Map*, was placed directly in the hands of Republican senators at a fundraising event in Florida for Senator Rick Scott. Founders of Cyrus Force were present, and their photos are on the homepage of www.CyrusForce.org.

The Ayatollah oligarchs have used that Constitution to justify hostility toward America and to loot the Iranian nation—moving nearly one trillion dollars into Western financial systems. That money is not only corruption—it is the financial oxygen of terrorism.

Mr. President, there is a simple and peaceful strategy that requires no war:

- 1- Read their Constitution yourself.
- 2- Confiscate the oligarchs' overseas funds. Nearly one trillion Dollars asset outside Iran.

If America cuts off the financial lifeline, the regime will be forced to accept a Constitutional Assembly (Moassessan) to change the Constitution itself. This aligns with the demands already alive inside Iran and removes the "need" for military conflict.

In the last six years, three historic manifestos inside Iran have demanded this exact path:

- 1- The Manifesto of 14 activists led by Mohammad Noorizad.
- 2- The Manifesto of 800 signatories inspired by Mir Hossein Mousavi, joined by 160 university professors.
- 3- The Manifesto of 17 courageous women led by Narges Mohammadi and supported by Nasrin Sotoudeh.

Millions of Iranians are ready for peaceful constitutional change. They do not ask America to fight their war—they ask America to stop financing their oppressors.

Mr. President, forgive my emotion, but after thirty years of writing, explaining, begging, and hoping, I sometimes feel like the Rabbi who prays every day at the Wall. For decades he speaks

his heart, but the wall gives no answer. After thirty years, I have had the same experience—I have been speaking to the wall.

But just like that Rabbi, I return the next day, because I believe that one hour of attention from the right President could change history.
